Course Description & Goals	How does historical and social change relate to cinematic imagination? What are the determinants of "national film" and how do these questions apply to the context of Korea? We trace what changes in Korean movies have taken place in the historical upheaval from the Japanese colonial rule through the military regime to the neoliberal era. Especially, the purpose of this class is to extend the viewpoint of film and history by creatively reinterpreting the various aspects of `modern` through the traces that interact with the film.
