#### **Prerequisites**

General entry requirements and English B (Field-specific entry requirements 6/A6).

## Objectives

After completing the course, the student should be able to:

- account for musical and visual means of expression in Sweden from historical and contemporary perspectives,
- identify and describe musical and visual means of expression from different time periods,
- relate musical and visual means of expression to contemporary cultural and societal contexts,
- exemplify and compare musical and visual means of expression in Sweden with the means of expression of another country or culture.

#### Content

This course starts with a general introduction to musical and visual means of expression in Sweden prior to 1720. After this, the course will focus on three time periods:

- the Age of Liberty and the Gustavian period,
- modernity and modernism,
- the present times.

All these will be studied from a combined approach to musical and visual means of expression in various social and cultural environments and institutions. The course will also discuss economic, technical, idea-historical and aesthetic changes. Throughout the

course, comparisons and connections are made between musical and visual means of expression in Sweden and in other countries and cultures the students are familiar with.

Participation in seminars is compulsory.

## Type of Instruction

Teaching is delivered in the form of lectures and seminars,

#### Examination

The course is assessed with the grades A, B, C, D, E, Fx or F.

The grade A is the highest grade and the grade E is the lowest grade for passing the course. The grade F means that the student's performance is assessed as failed. For students who do not pass the first examinations, retake examinations are provided in accordance with local regulations at the university.

The course is examined through written assignments and active participation in seminars.

## **Course Evaluation**

At the end of the course, a course evaluation is conducted. Results and analysis of the course evaluation are communicated to the students who have taken the course and the students who are taking the course when it is offered the next time. The evaluation is anonymous. The course evaluation is filed according to departmental regulations.

#### Other

Assessment criteria for the A–F scale are communicated to the students in a separate document. The students are informed about the assessment criteria when the course starts, at the latest.
