In the second half of the semester, we will move on to learn traditional arts of Korea in depth including Korean traditional architecture, classical literature, traditional costume, traditional court and folk music and dance, and various traditional paintings.							
Course Description	This course focuses on enhancing knowledge and cross cultural awareness on Korean foundation and royal myths and traditional arts for foreign and Korean students in English.
