COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Audiovisual Documentation course seeks to provide students with a series of necessary knowledge so that they can effectively develop their intellectual and professional capacities. Specifically, the subject focuses its main contents on the need for documentation and audiovisual research as the basis of all information, understanding the meaning of each of the constituent elements of the communicative activity. In this way, the student will be able to apply what they have learned to carry out studies, research and analysis on audiovisual productions and programs, related to the management of sources documentaries, data and documentation applied to the different communication processes with a character professional, effective and efficient.

The contents of the subject are based on the concept of documentation as a scientific discipline and provide students the basic knowledge of a multidisciplinary science such as documentation.

The course focuses first of all on the need for documentation as the foundation of all information and specifically audiovisual documentation.

The student is introduced to research developing the fundamentals of the work methodology university and scientist.

Secondly, the mechanisms and processes that the information follows are exposed from the moment it is produced to the that reaches users. The different sources of information that are considered as essential to be able to document the professional work teaching the student the treatment and retrieval of documentary information to carry out its communicative activity.

This approach to information search and retrieval strategies and resources is applied in the part practice of the subject where students must use these resources to develop a series of content audiovisual. So that through practical work they can experience the difficulties of the research and documentary search derived from the process of creating content in audiovisual.

Know the main concepts of documentation and audiovisual research in storage, organization, management, exhibition and analysis of audiovisual products. Learn to use these concepts by through the development of different audiovisual content.

FORMATION ACTIVITIES

Lectures: the teacher will present the contents through lectures and propose activities complementary such as viewings and exercises where students, with the help of the teacher, will delve into the fundamental concepts. The student will participate with questions and contributions as a result of their reflections. What's more, They will have to present the practical work to the rest of the group. The student must demonstrate that has achieved the objectives and competencies set out in the subject by presenting all the practical exercises.

Complementary activities: Document search exercises will be carried out in a group Work in groups: in order to deepen the fundamental concepts and put into practice the Proposed competencies, students will have to carry out a series of audiovisual works. In them will be used the proposed sources and the contents of the lectures for your documentary research work.

The compulsory jobs are:

- The teacher will give a list of themes that occurred in the story and each group will have to select one and document and investigate the event WITHOUT using the internet or network documentation. For then make a documentary with the information and audiovisual resources obtained.
- Students must choose a relevant historical personality and investigate everything related to it to

then elaborate an audiovisual piece with what they have found out. It will be necessary to collect data on his biography, place the viewer in the historical context in which the character lived, find out the facts why this person is relevant, events related to him, curiosities, etc. The audiovisual piece may be done freely, that is, using the format that the students wish, documentary, video clip, fiction short film (being rigorous with the historical truth and the setting), etc.

- Students must make a documentary piece showing the documentation process and production of a film or series with historical content. The investigation must reflect both the previous work of historical documentation that is done at the time of writing the script as the work that is done during the production at the time of reproducing the costumes and the setting of the time represented. For this it will be necessary contact the production companies, find out how this work was, who intervened (historical advisers, military, producers, scriptwriters), if they hired specialized companies, etc. and contact them in turn, record interviews, find out the process that was carried out, the problems they encountered, how the solved, trivia, etc.
