Course Objective

The student:

- 1 Has acquired factual knowledge about the history of modern philosophy, including but not limited to Descartes, Van Schurman, Leibniz, Amo, Du Châtelet, Kant, Fichte, Hegel, Marx, Paulsen, and Brentano
- 2 Has acquired conceptual knowledge about the main arguments and theories relevant for the period, i.a. rationalism, empiricism, skepticism, idealism, realism, etc. as well as a critical understanding of periodizations such as modernity, enlightenment, renaissance, etc.
- 3 Has acquired metacognitive knowledge about studying the history of philosophy and how it relates to their present as well as (the history of) other philosophical, humanistic, and scientific disciplines.

Course Content

- Introduction to the philosophers and theories of the modern period through the Reverse Engineering approach
- study of primary texts, individually and in groups;
- the historical context in which the philosophers and theories developed;
- the meaning and relevance of the history of philosophy;
- reading and understanding the original sources.

Method of Assessment

The final grade will be determined by weekly on-line assignments (annotations and group discussion of the primary texts on Perusall) as well as a final written examination with open questions about the texts.
