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COURSE UNIT INFORMATION

Learning outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Conceptualize the issue of linguistic minorities in the light of multilingualism and linguistic diversity on the one hand, and to historical-political and socio-economic issues on the other
- 2. Critically evaluate and objectify minority and majority view on linguistic diversity per case and comparatively evaluate the case of different linguistic minorities, most specifically with regard to Swedishspeaking Finns as a reference of comparison
- 3. Understand the patters of interlanguage communication in the different cases and relate interlanguage communication the retention of multilingualism and linguistic diversity

Contents

The course consists of an introductory lecture about the Swedish language group in Finland, and then a set of guest lectures about the situation of various linguistic minorities and a theoretical approach to study interlingustic communication. Each lecture will end up with a comparative analysis of and discussion on the given linguistic minority and Swedish-speaking Finns.

Activities and teaching methods in support of learning

Lectures, discussions and individual work.
