Course Description	This course is designed for students with no background in Japanese. It mainly focuses on oral communication in Japanese. The course introduces basic sentence structures, vocabulary, and daily expressions as well as reading of Japanese alphabets: Hiragana and Katakana.
Course Objectives	This course aims at developing basic oral communication skills in Japanese. By the end of this course, you are expected to handle daily conversation and read simple texts in Japanese.
Expected work outside of class	Review course materials, do homework assignments, prepare for quizzes and lesson tests.
