Traveling through the history from ancient times to the early twentieth century, we will investigate a wide range of issues concerning women, such as political participation, marriage, reproduction, religion, education, occupations, and social roles. In addition to the lectures, the class will emphasize discussions based on a critical analysis of the assigned reading materials.

There will be assignments to guide their preparation using Perusall or Moodle. 2) Students will review class materials in order to get prepared for presentations and papers, which will require about 60 hours.</p>

<p>評価基準・割合 / Evaluation</p>	<p><b>授業参加 / Class participation</b> (20.0%) <b>レポート / Report</b> (40.0%) <b>その他 / Others(in detail)</b> (40.0%) : 1) Class participation (20%): Participation to class activities will be evaluated as a whole. Contributing actively to group work and discussions with well-founded comments will be evaluated as a plus. Simply attending class does not equal participation.  2) Report assignments (40%): At the end of the term, students will write an essay (a minimum of 1500 words) based on a critical analysis of the course materials. They will be asked to report about their work in progress and review other students' drafts (details explained in class). These reports and reviews will be evaluated as well as the final paper.  3) Others (40%) a. Analysis of a primary source (20%): Students will choose a primary source and write an analysis and present their findings in class. The format and length of the presentation will depend on the class size. b. Homework assignments (20%): There will be homework assignments to assist students' understanding of readings or proceeding with group work. Conscientious completion of these will be evaluated in this category.</p>
