Course Objective

Students are able to analyze morphological and semantical phenomena and to study the relevant literature independently. They are able to identify weaknesses and strengths of the analyses and to report on their findings in a clear and straightforward way.

Course Content

Students learn the basic principles of morphology and semantics of natural language. They understand the problems and some of the most important suggested solutions. They learn about different semantic theories from different starting points.

Additional Information Teaching Methods

There are two meetings of two hours each week. The meetings are interactive and active student participation is expected. We will discuss study material and assignments in class.

Method of Assessment

Assignments and presentations (50%), final exam (50%).
To pass, both should be at least 5, with a minimum average of 5.5.

The kind of exam (take home, open book, oral or other) is to be discussed on the first meeting.

Entry Requirements

Students must have passed Introduction to Linguistics (L_AABACIW103).
