Course Objective

After finishing this course, the student:

- has an overview of the history and the world in which the Old Testament originates (BA Objective: knowledge of one religion)
- is able to reproduce theories about the origins of Old Testament texts, and their arguments (BA Objective: ability to think critically, consistently, and logically)
- is able to discuss the pros and cons of academic approaches to the Old Testament (BA Objective: differentiate between external and internal perspectives)

Course Content

Necessary knowledge of, and insight in, the Old Testament, how it came into being, the world in which it originates, the geographical, economical and political background, as well as its reception history and the history of academic approachtes to the texts.
