Course Objective

After finishing this course the student:

- is familiar with the most important introductory questions and problems regarding the writings of the New Testament;
- is aware of the complex history of the growth of these writings;
- is able to position her-/himself in the academic debate surrounding the writings of the New Testament;
- is able to apply the acquired insights in reading New Testament texts.

Course Content

The student will have to read the assigned literature for this course and participate in assignments intended to deepen the reflection on this literature. Crucial questions will be dealt with in class, such as the synoptic problem (how do Matthew, Mark, and Luke relate to each other?), the authorship of the Pauline epistles (seven undisputed letters vs six disputed letters), the first principles of textual criticism, and the formation of the Christian canon.
